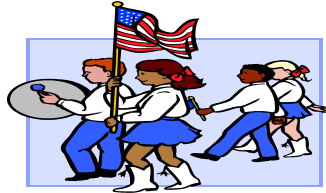

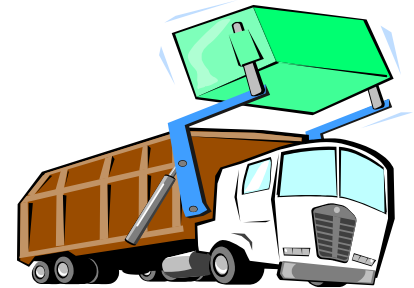


Edgemere Parade

The Millers Island Community Association will sponsor a dumpster day on Saturday, September 24th from 8:00 AM—Noon. Bob Hart, Vice President of the Association has organized this event. Much thanks to Bob. So take the next couple of weeks to gather your junk so you are ready for Dumpster Day. Here are the rules. We have approval for up to (4) dumpsters, two at a time, A2Z will bring us two dumpsters, when they are full they will pick those two up and drop off two more. Here is a list of prohibited items so please don't bring these items for disposal. We cannot accept them: explosive or flammable materials, acids, pesticides, chemicals, medical/radioactive waste, liquid waste, drums or tanks, animal carcasses, large stumps, wood/logs greater than 8" diameter and 6' length, most large items that cannot be lifted manually. The dumpsters will be located in the parking lot of the playground and the traffic pattern will be enter from Bay Drive, exit on Millers Island Rd. Anyone wishing to volunteer is urged to contact the Association. The dumpsters will be supervised by Community Association personnel. Be patient, work with us and I'm sure we can have a successful day.
