## ROAD ENDING CONCERNS

Wow you don't know how I hate to bring this up. However, it has been brought to my attention from Baltimore County Parks and Recs that some of us are not complying with the rules established in reference to the road endings. So here goes, this is what I was told. You cannot cut the chains, cut and/or bust off the locks, remove or split the wooden posts. If you need to have the chain removed for a special event or you are hav-

ing construction or work done to your home and you need to utilize this space you are to call Denise Spurrier (410) 887-7529 at least 48 hours notice and advise approximately how long you will need the chain down. The lock will then be removed by the county and returned at the completion of the event. The county does not want to make destruction of property reports for the destroyed property. So lets work together so we don't have a problem with these road endings.
